• Age 21 to 29 every three years with cytology alone • Frequency of screening may increase to every five years for women age 30 to 65 with cytology and high-risk human papillomavirus cotesting

Which preventive care services do infants and children need? Frequent checkups to track growth and development; Blood tests for lead (twice before age 2), iron (once by age 1), and cholesterol (once between the ages of 9 and 11) Dental cleaning and exam twice a year, starting at age 2 ½ ; Vaccines ; Immunizations for Infants and Children

Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) Infection: Screening: adolescents and adults aged 15 to 65

years. The USPSTF recommends that clinicians screen for HIV infection in adolescents and adults aged 15 to 65 years. Younger adolescents and older adults who are at increased risk of infection should also be screened.

Lung cancer screening for adults 55-80 at high risk for lung cancer because they're heavy smokers or have quit in the past 15 years. Obesity screening and counseling. Sexually transmitted infection (STI) prevention counseling for adults at higher risk. Statin preventive medication for adults 40 to 75 at high risk.
